COMMEMORATING AUGUSTA AFRICAN AMERICAN CHAMPION CADDIES, 1932-1982 AND DISTINGUISHED AFRICAN AMERICAN GOLF HERITAGE STORIES

DEDICATED APRIL 3, 2025

The larger-than-life faces of Augusta National Golf Club Masters Tournament Champion Caddies William Stokes, Willie Peterson, Jr., Edwin B. McCoy, Jr., Jariah Beard, Sr., Carl Jackson, and Roosevelt Smalley, Sr., span multiple eras, representing the enduring global legacy of Augusta's African American caddies.

Muralist and arts educator Baruti Tucker applied his *awfingah* technique to vibrantly captivate their images and iconic fairway scenes. These caddies played an essential, but often overlooked role in professional golf. Their expertise guided champion golfers to historic victories, while their own names remained in the shadows-often either erroneously recorded or forgotten. Caddie names for the Augusta Invitational, renamed the Masters Tournament, are considered lost to history. The azalea wreath at the flat end of the tee represents the crucial 11th, 12th, and 13th holes of the Augusta National collectively named "the Amen Corner."

The accompanying written tributes also acknowledge other well-known career employees whose collective behind-the scenes mastery helped define the Augusta National experience. For generations, African American contract caddies were the dominant presence on Augusta's courses, from the Augusta Country Club (1899) to Forest Hill Golf Club (1925), culminating at the Augusta National Golf Club, constructed during 1931-1932.

Many caddies had worked as youth alongside their relatives to transform Fruitlands Nursery into what would become the world-renowned Augusta National. Over time, these homegrown caddies amassed an unrivaled knowledge of the course's terrain. Their own love of the game and skills as golfers were pursued more readily among themselves and golf enthusiasts at the Augusta Municipal Golf Club, affectionately named "The Patch," after its desegregation in 1964. Participation in annual events such as the Augusta National Caddie Tournament, The Augusta Herald Amateur Golf Tournament, and the Augusta Black Festival Golf Tournament exhibited their own competitive strengths as golfers.

The path to Augusta National often began at the Augusta Country Club. Successive Caddie Masters served as mentors, honing core competence and building corps camaraderie. Known also as "men on the bag" and "loopers," the majority of these caddies came from the Sand Hills and Harrisburg Historic Districts, within walking distance from the course. Others carpooled from across the city notably Laney-Walker Historic and Bethlehem Historic Districts to take part in this storied tradition. The inscribed bricks are a tribute to early caddies. A QR code on the permanent outdoor interpretive panels will accommodate additional names, as they are received.

This sculpture joins those installed by Edward Durant at Forest Hills Golf Club and First Tee-Augusta, symbolizing Augusta's profound influence on the world of golf and its significant social and economic impact.

The most significant breakthrough of this project is the revelation of the correct name of the first recorded Masters Champion Caddie to be John Henry "Stovepipe" Gordon, previously published since 1935 as Thor "Stovepipe" Nordwall. Personal interviews with the King-Thurmond Family and Mr. Jariah Beard, along with official documents corroborated necessary details to support the change. The following families also provided indispensable historical information, lending greater authenticity to collection of the caddies' personal information: The Bennett Family, Choice-McCoy-Carpenter Family, Dent Family, O'Bryant Family, Hawes-Smalley Family. The recollections and artifacts of Mr. Philip R. Wahl II have enhanced the overall promotion of this legacy.

THE TRANSITION FROM CADDIE TO GOLF TITLEHOLDER

WALTER T. HOGAN, A SMALLEY RELATIVE, PERMANENTLY RELOCATED FROM SAND HILLS HISTORIC DISTRICT TO SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA TO PURSUE HIS YOUTHFUL DREAMS. IN 1960, SPONSORED BY INDIAN WELLS GOLF CLUB, HE WON THE SHERATON-WEST CHAMPIONSHIP, FOLLOWED BY THE TWO-BALL FOURSOME JUNIOR TITLE IN THE AUSTRALIAN JUNOR AMATEUR TOURNAMENT. THESE SOLID VICTORIES LED TO WINNING THE BRITISH JUNIOR GOLF TITLE IN 1961.

JAMES L. "BIG BOY" DENT, ALSO REARED IN SAND HILLS HISTORIC DISTRICT, COURAGEOUSLY ENTERED THE PROFESSIONAL TOUR AS A CADDIE IN 1966. HIS ASCENT IN 1970 FROM CADDIE TO EARNING HIS PGA TOUR CARD AS A GOLFER, IS MARKED BY 12 CHAMPIONSHIPS ON THE PGA CHAMPIONS TOUR. AMONG HIS MANY HONORS AS A SENIOR PLAYER, IN 1990 AND 1991 HE SERVED ON THE UNITED STATES DUPONT TEAMS. IN 1992, HIS PERSEVERANCE AS A PGA GOLFER ACCUMULATED INTO THE MOST MONEY WON IN A SINGLE SEASON, WITHOUT A VICTORY. IN 2020, THE ENTRANCE TO THE AUGUSTA MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE ("THE PATCH'), CONSTRUCTED IN 1928, BECAME RENAMED JIM DENT WAY IN HIS HONOR.

AFRICAN AMERICANS IN GOLF BEYOND "THE HILL"

IN JULY 1930, THE RISING NATIONAL AND LOCAL POPULARITY OF MINIATURE GOLF PROMPTED THE OPENING OF SILVER PUTTER (MIDGET) GOLF COURSE NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF SPRUCE AND NINTH STREETS (NOW JAMES BROWN BOULEVARD) IN LANEY-WALKER HISTORIC DISTRICT.

MANY OF THE BEST-KNOWN ENTREPRENEURS AND CIVIC LEADERS OF THE DISTRICT'S "GOLDEN BLOCKS" ERA BECAME AVID GOLFERS. NOTABLY AMONG THESE RECORDED ENTHUSIASTS ARE: CIVIL RIGHTS ADVOCATE ALBERT BAMPFIELD, REALTY DEVELOPER O.M. BLOUNT, NEGRO NEWS EDITOR WALTER HARRIS AND BROTHER TAILOR NORMAN HARRIS, MASONRY CONTRACTOR JAMES C. MCNATT, NEGRO NEWS EDITOR JOHN C. MARDENBORUGH, FUNERAL DIRECTOR W.H. MAYS, SR., REALTOR JAMES G. PICKENS, AND LENOX THEATRE MANAGER EARL S. PINKERTON, SR. IN ADDITION TO THEIR INDIVIDUAL STORIES OF OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY CONTRIBUTION DURING AND AFTER THE PROTRACTED PERIOD OF THE GREAT DEPRESSION, THEY ADD GLEAM AND EXPENDANDED PERCEPTION TO AUGUSTA'S AFRICAN AMERICAN GOLF HERITAGE.
